Works Cited

Works Cited is centered, no underline/italics.

Don't type headings (**Book by One Author**).

Book by One/Two Author

Connor, Paul W., and Tina Davis. *Benjamin Franklin*. Boston: Little, 2005. Print.

Book with NO Author

Nebraska Moments. Lincoln: University of Nebraska Press, 2004. Print.

Book by One Editor

Snover, Stephen L., Ed. *Mathematical Problem-Solving with the Computer*. Englewood Cliffs: Prentice, 2006. Print.

Multi-volume Literary Criticisms (CLC, TCLC, etc.)

Moravia, Alberto. "Truman Capote." *Contemporary Literary Criticism*. Vol. 13. Detroit: Gale Research, 2005. 323-325. Print.

Books containing essays written by COLLECTIVE AUTHORS

Wilson, Edmund. "Hemmingway: Gauge of Morale." *Ernest Hemmingway*. Ed. Harold Bloom. New York: Chelsea House, 2005. 60-72. Print.

Personal Interview

Getzschman, Scott. Personal interview. 18 October 2011.

The list will be alphabetical by the authors' names or the first word of each entry.

Magazines, Newspapers, Academic Journals

Remember, every entry ends with a period.

Pay attention to the format; online citations aren't always accurate.

WORLD WIDE WEB CITATIONS

Website sources work very much like printed sources. Your priority is to give credit to the person or group that is responsible for the information. If any information is unavailable, for online sources only, MLA 7 suggests writing “n.p.” or “n.d.” for no publisher and no date, respectively. If you are missing three or more parts of the website citation, find that information on a more reliable source that does provide the needed parts of the citation.
