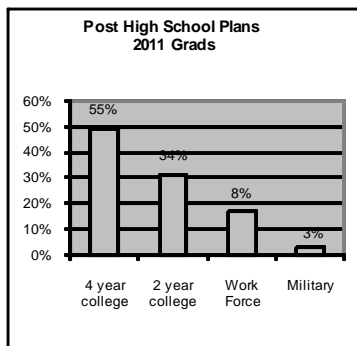
The Nebraska Department of Education has awarded Fremont High with the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges' highest recognition, "AA" accreditation.

## COMMUNITY

Fremont, Nebraska, is a rural, college town of 26,000 people. It is located in Dodge County, 20 miles northwest of Omaha. Fremont hosts a 100-bed hospital, Midland University and a Metropolitan Community College campus. Income is derived primarily from agriculture-related industry.



The class of 2011 was offered over \$4.2 million in scholarship awards.

## NATIONAL TEST RESULTS

With 64% of the students testing, the mean ACT score for the graduation class of 2011 was 21.8. The Nebraska mean score was 22.1, and the national mean score was 21.0.

## SCHEDULE

The school day consists of four eighty-eight minute blocks. Each class meets every day for one block. Five credits are granted for passing each quarter course. (Vocal music, instrumental music, debate, journalism and select social science classes may be flex-scheduled.)

The year is divided into two eighteen-week terms; each term has two nine-week quarters. Students are required to carry 20 credit hours each quarter and may earn 80 credits per year.

## SPECIAL CURRICULUM PROGRAMS

In addition to Honors and Advanced Placement courses, students seeking additional academic challenge may enroll in Analytical Composition, Information Technology, US History or German 5 and earn college credit. Seniors may also take classes at Midland University or at Metropolitan Community College. A School-to-Career program allows students to apply their knowledge and skills in a variety of school and community volunteer settings. The standard special education curriculum at Fremont High School includes programs in Independent Living Skills and Basic Skills to assist all students in achieving their potential.
