NovaNET is an on-line computer-based education network that provides a comprehensive course offering for students in grades 7-12. It integrates the power of individualized, computer-based instruction with the flexibility of on-line delivery. The NovaNET program is designed to provide remediation, course recovery, and credit recovery. NovaNET meets the standards set by the state of Nebraska.*

*Fremont High students, grades 9-12, must successfully pass the Nova NET course and the course CRT, if developed, for credit.

Enrollment: Students must complete this registration form and have it signed by a school counselor and parent/guardian. Registration may be completed by bringing this completed form and payment by **May 27th, 2010** to Lynn Fuchser at Fremont Public School Central Offices at 130 E. 9th. Fremont, NE. Phone: 727-3000. Enrollment limited to one class per session unless the school counselor recommends another class.

Payment: \$150 per 5 credit course. \$210 out of district. Payment due upon registration. Certified check or cash for the full amount only. Registration will not be refunded after the second day of classes. Registration will be accepted on a space available basis. Seniors will be given priority.

Fremont High School Code of Conduct:

**Student and parent signatures acknowledge any violation of the student code of conduct shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including referral for criminal prosecution for violation of law.*

1. Use of violence, force, coercion, threat, intimidation, or similar conduct in a manner that constitutes a substantial interference with school purposes;
2. Willfully causing or attempting to cause substantial damage to property, stealing or attempting to steal property of substantial value, or repeated damage or theft involving property;
3. Causing or attempting to cause personal injury to a school employee, to a school volunteer, or to any student; Personal injury caused by accident, self-defense, or other action undertaken on the reasonable belief that it was necessary to protect some other person shall not constitute a violation of this subdivision;
4. Threatening or intimidating any student for the purpose of or with the intent of obtaining money or anything of value from such student;
5. Knowingly possessing, handling, or transmitting any object or material that is ordinarily or generally considered a weapon;
6. Engaging in the selling, using, possessing, or dispensing of alcohol, tobacco, drugs, a controlled substance, inhalants, or being under the influence of any of the above; possession of drug paraphernalia; or engaging in selling, using, possessing or dispensing of an imitation controlled substance as defined in 28-401 of the Nebraska statutes, or material represented to be an alcoholic beverage, narcotic, a drug, an imitation controlled substance, or an inhalant;
7. Public indecency as defined in section 28-806 of the Nebraska statutes except that this paragraph shall apply only to students at least twelve years of age but less than nineteen years of age;
8. Sexually assaulting or attempting to sexually assault any person regardless of the time or location of the assault or attempted assault if a prosecutor has filed a complaint in a court of competent jurisdiction alleging such conduct;
9. Engaging in any other activity forbidden by the laws of the State of Nebraska which activity constitutes a danger to other students or interferes with school purposes;
10. A repeated violation of any rules and standards, if such violations constitute a substantial interference with school purposes;
11. Gambling;
12. Use or possession of vulgar or obscene literature, technology, or use of obscene language;
13. Gross disrespect to teachers, school officials, other school employees, or volunteers;
14. Behavior which seriously interferes with class work or other school activities;
15. Plagiarism or dishonesty;
16. Being out of the building without permission, loitering on school property before or after assigned classes, or any unauthorized presence at the building or, in any part of the building;
17. Causing a false fire alarm;
18. Use or possession of any form of tobacco;
19. Violation of any student dress code;
20. Harassment of any student or school district employee on the basis of the individual's race, national origin, sex, disability, age, religious beliefs, personal appearance, or marital status.
21. Insubordination: Willfully disobeying any reasonable written or oral request of a school staff member, or the voicing of disrespect to those in authority.
22. Bullying behavior in the form of name-calling of any kind or type which is defamatory in nature, direct or indirect threats towards a person or group of people based on their perceived or actual physical characteristics or identities, and /or spreading of rumors or gossip.
