

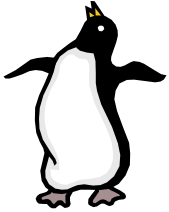
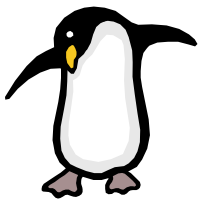

Heart attacks and strokes are medical emergencies! Learn these warning signs and act quickly if you see someone having them...

Heart Attack Warning Signs

- ◆ Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes or goes away and comes back.
- ◆ Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- ◆ Shortness of breath, with or without chest discomfort.
- ◆ Other signs such as breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

Stroke Warning Signs

- ◆ Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body.
- ◆ Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.
- ◆ Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- ◆ Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination.
- ◆ Sudden, severe headache with no known cause.

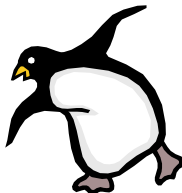
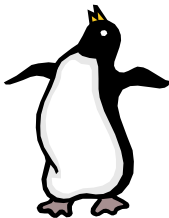
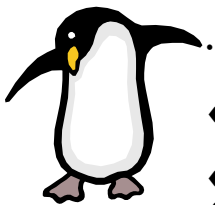
Not all of these warning signs occur in every heart attack or stroke. If some start to occur, get help immediately. Call 9-1-1.
